# Oregon Voices Data Summary



### **About the Summary**

Oregon Voices began in summer of 2021 when The Ford Family Foundation invited 18,000 randomly selected households — 500 in each Oregon county — to complete a survey online or by mailing back a paper response. We then reached out to Ford Family friends and partners, encouraging them to participate and invite others to do the same. In total more than 4,300 Oregonians from all walks of life responded to the survey, generously sharing their honest reflections on the question we posed: What is it like to live in your corner of the state?


The following report provides a high-level summary of the survey data received from those who responded in Benton County. Here the number of random household respondents outnumbered the Ford Family respondents. For clarity, the two data sets have been combined in the visualizations below, even though the two samples show differences in demographics and response patterns. Please interpret the findings with this in mind. Data have been rounded to the nearest whole number.

# **Key Highlights**

- Benton County is home to the state's land grant university, Oregon State University, where over 35,000 students are enrolled. Respondents appreciate the university's impact on the community.
- Respondents appreciate their community's easily accessible, walkable and bike-friendly transportation options and are concerned that population growth is placing a strain on infrastructure and traffic.
- Respondents indicated significant concern about the increase in the cost of living and unaffordable housing, and nearly 75% of respondents echoed that "homelessness is a challenge" where they live.







"Life is hard for most people and there should be a fairer wealth distribution. How can anyone live on \$1,500 a month if rent is \$1,200?"


"High education levels, cultural and outdoor opportunities, tolerance of diversity, and science and environmental awareness"

#### Race/Ethnicity









#### **Community participation**

"There is a strong sense of community and the way people take care of each other, including disadvantaged members of the community."

"Everyone is always eager to chat when walking around the neighborhood, and there is generally a sense of belonging."

"We are a privileged community — well educated, stable finances, active retired people, positive view of the world — in general. What distresses me is the increase in uncivil discourse and behavior, even here and much more in other parts of the state. That we are a less civil society and that individuals seem to have less regard for how we are tied together concerns me for our future."

"There seems to be new growth and energy in this small rural town that has become a bedroom community." Respondents indicated the extent to which they perceive that people where they live participate in their community in the following ways:









#### **Services**

"I feel that mental health services for children and adolescents are underfunded and simply not available at the level they need to be."

"En ocasiones no acompleto para el pago de la renta." ("Sometimes I do not have enough money to pay rent.")

"I would like to have more department stores in Corvallis and restaurants like Olive Garden or Texas Roadhouse and more housing in rural areas where there could be trails and a place to garden."

"No real internet options"

"Lack of basic needs jobs, housing and quality education"

"Jobs do not pay enough for the cost of living in this community."

"We lack supports for the growing number [of] Latino families. All local jobs are either agricultural work or in the service industry, meaning they are low paying." Respondents who reported they "agree" or "strongly agree" the following services are available where they live:
